授業のねらい・内容・方法										

This course aims at developing the skills listed below. In order to pass this course, students must demonstrate these skills satisfactorily in terms of the instructor's criteria at least 60% of the time.

- a). To talk slowly, loudly, and clearly in English.
- b). To differentiate, both in listening comprehension and in pronunciation, English consonants and vowels that are often misheard or mispronounced by native speakers of Japanese.
- c). To express a complete thought regularly in a sentence that is complete with a subject and a predicate and with few grammatical mistakes.
- d). To convey the most important point to the hearer and to understand the most important point of the speaker.

A topic of conversation/discussion will be assigned each week. Students are expected to prepare for the conversation/discussion by organizing their thoughts on the topic and studying words and expressions that are necessary to express their ideas. Students must bring the handouts for pronunciation exercises and for conversation/discussion, an English-Japanese (or English-English) dictionary, and a notebook to the class.
