授業のねらい/授業方法(学習指導法)/授業到達目標 授業のねらい: This class is focused on giving the students the opportunity to improve their English communication skills. 授業方法(学習指導法): The students will be given instruction in how to communicate effectively in English, including language skills, cultural differences in communication styles between native English speakers and native Japanese speakers, and body language. 授業到達目標: The goal of this class is to give each student a deeper understanding of how to communicate effectively in English. The students will also be able to use methods of communicating practised in class in their encounters with English speakers in their everyday lives.

教科書・教材・参考書	Because every class has a variety of skill levels, and each department values English education differently, the overall level of each class varies greatly from department to department and from semester to semester. It is therefore important for the instructor to evaluate the students during the first class period of each semester before deciding on a textbook. This evaluation is crucial in choosing a textbook which will best suit a particular class.		
成績評価の方法・基準等	The test for this class will consist entirely of essay questions. The questions will focus not on what the textbook or the instructor said, but rather what the student learned from what was covered in the class. Spelling or grammatical errors on the test are not deducted from the overall test score, providing the errors are not so great as to render the essay answer incomprehensible. A percentage breakdown is as follows: *25% attendance *25% completion of homework, classroom assignments, adherence to rules of classroom behaviour. *50% test		
受講要件(履修条件)	Attendance is therefore not only strongly encouraged, it is vitally important to successful completion of this class. Furthermore, students are expected to come to class prepared and to follow simple classroom rules of behaviour. These rules are simple and specific-No using cell phones, no leaving the class without permission, no repeated tardiness, no disruption of the lecture or disturbing other students, and no sleeping. Repeated breaking of any or all of these rules will result in failure of the class.
