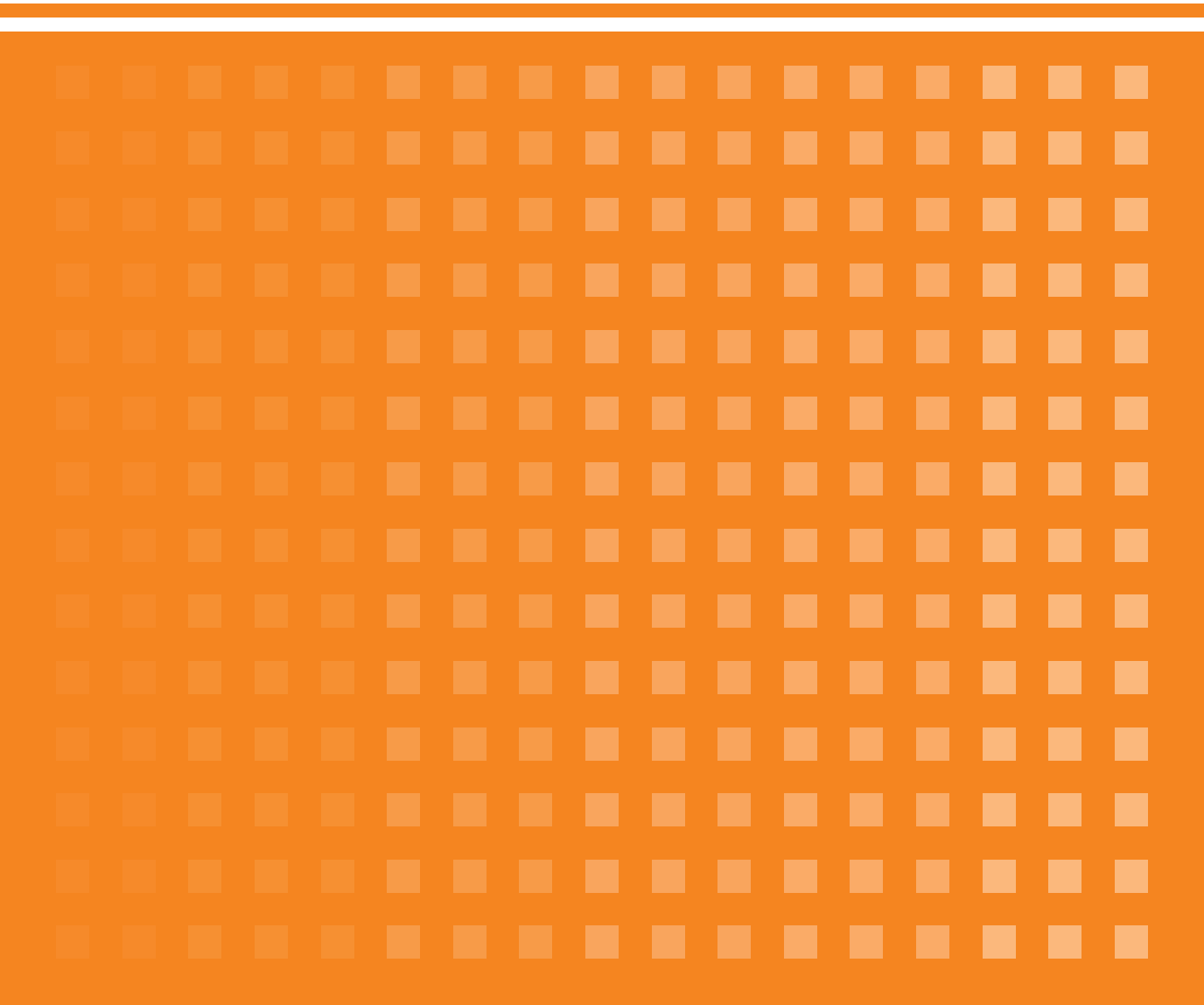

Nagasaki University's Philosophy

Nagasaki University contributes to the improvement of a well-balanced society by transmitting its inheritance of the traditional culture rooted in Nagasaki, cultivating a fertile creative sense in students, and developing innovative science for world peace.

Fundamental Goals of the University

Nagasaki University traces its roots back to a series of medical lectures, the first ever given in Japan, delivered by the Dutch Naval doctor J.L.C. Pompe van Meerdervoort in 1857. After experiencing devastation by the atomic bombing, it reopened as a university of five faculties and one research institute in 1949, in a merger of several educational institutions of different academic disciplines.

The university has the following philosophy: “Nagasaki University community share the pride and innovative spirit of Dejima(*) as a place of study. We maintain an attitude to learn even from serious consequences of inhumane decisions made about religion and the use of science. We will provide education and conduct research based on a clear intention and willingness to realize a world where people can coexist peacefully. We will contribute to the peaceful development of the local community and international society by passing on accumulated knowledge beyond the boundaries of time and people’s perceptions of value, fostering a rich spirit of cherishing humanity, and creating new science that will pave the way to the future”. At the beginning of 2025, the university encompasses 10 faculties, six graduate schools, one interfaculty initiative, three research institutes, and the Nagasaki University Hospital.

During the third medium-term goal period (2016-2022), Nagasaki University has enhanced its capacity as a university which contributes to global health mainly in the field of infectious diseases, one of the well-known research areas of the university. Its initiatives during the period include the implementation of the Global Health Elite Programme for Building a Healthier World (2018-2024). It is a joint effort between Nagasaki University and the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, and was selected for the Doctoral Program for World-leading Innovative & Smart Education by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology. Another such example is the completion of the BSL-4 Lab (in 2021).

For the fourth medium-term goal period (2022-2028), the university is determined to broaden its horizons from global health to planetary health. In the 21st century, climate change, food crises, biodiversity loss, environmental pollution, poverty, inequality, and pandemics caused by human activities became increasingly difficult issues. These contemporary regional and environmental issues are becoming more multilayered and diverse on a global scale, and their impact on human well-being and health is also becoming increasingly evident. Nagasaki University aims to become a world-class center of planetary health education and research which contributes to the realization of planetary health by bringing together and creating knowledge through transdisciplinary manner.

*Dejima is a man-made small island in the port of Nagasaki which served as a Dutch trading post between the early 17th to the mid-19th century, and was the only official place of trade between Japan and Western countries during the country’s more than 200-year period under the policy of seclusion.

Historical Sketch

The origin of Nagasaki University can be traced back to the time when Dutch naval physician Dr. Pompe van Meerdervoort began providing medical training at the West Office of the Nagasaki Magistrate's Office on November 12, 1857 (Ansei 4, September 26 in the Japanese calendar).

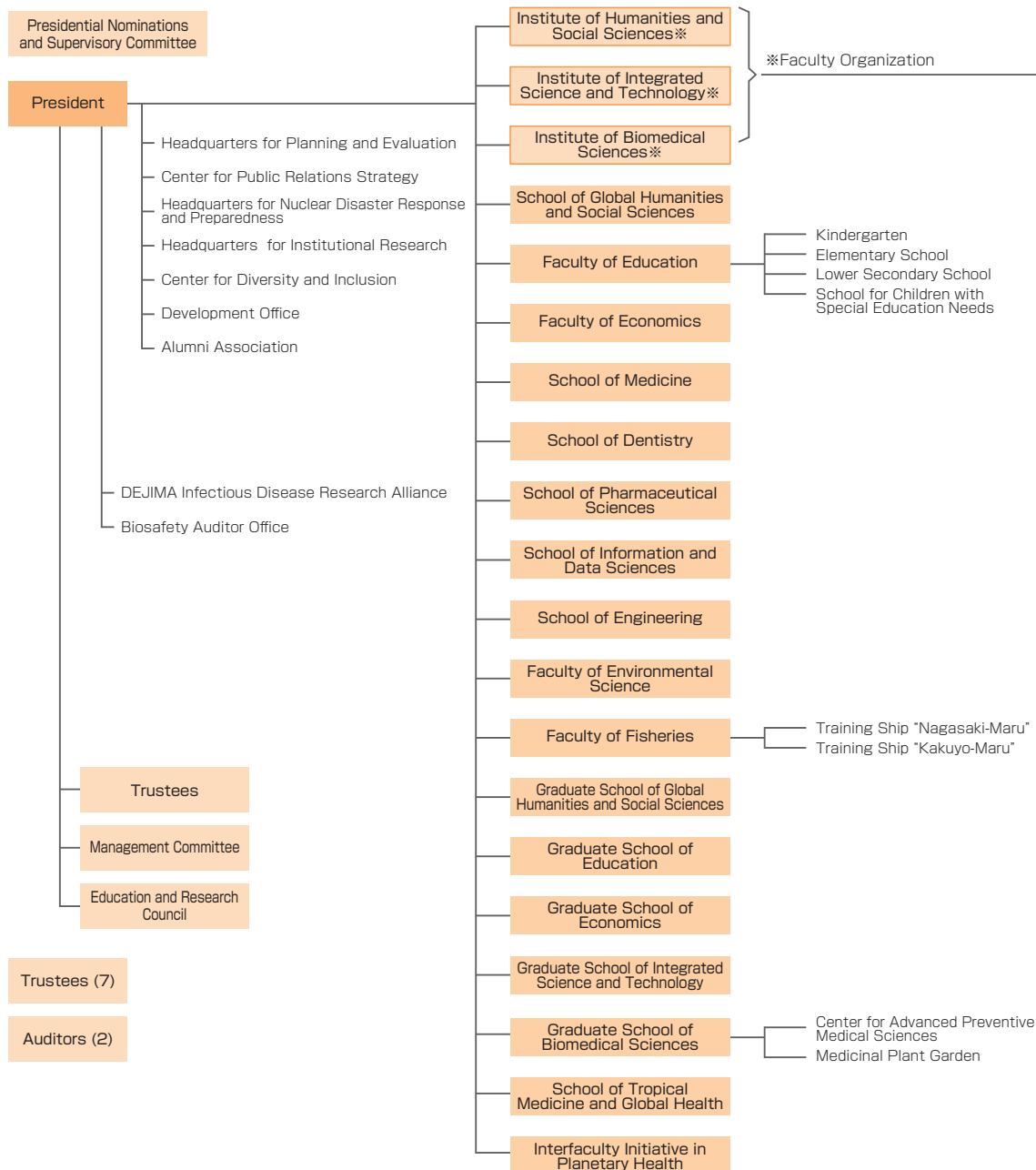

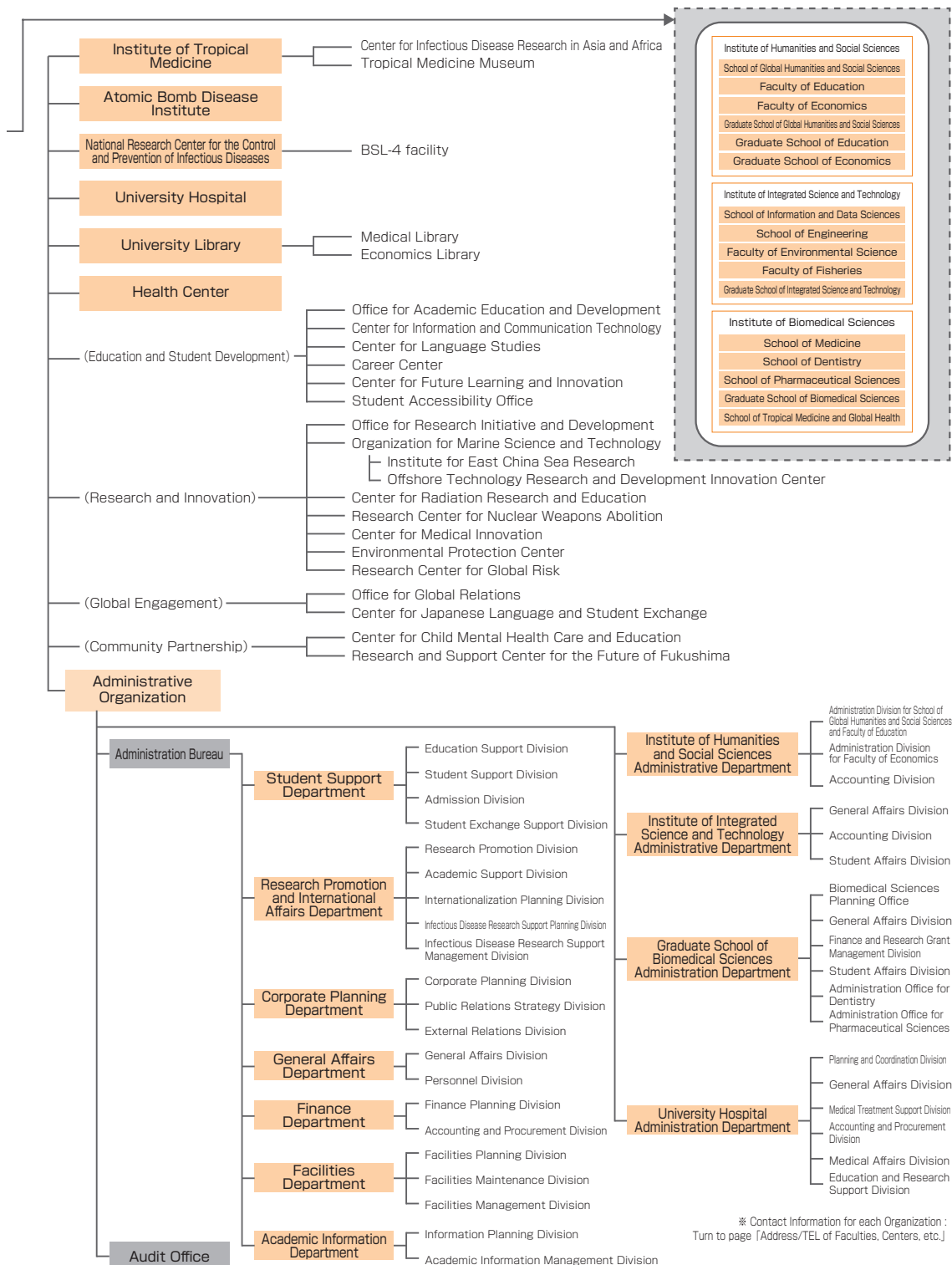

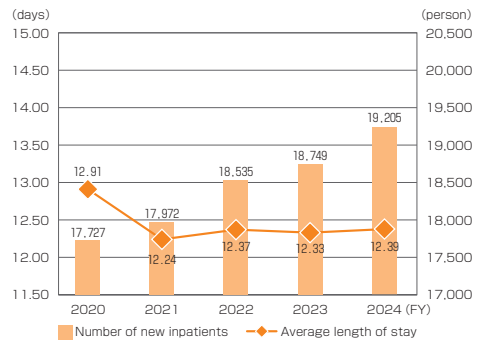

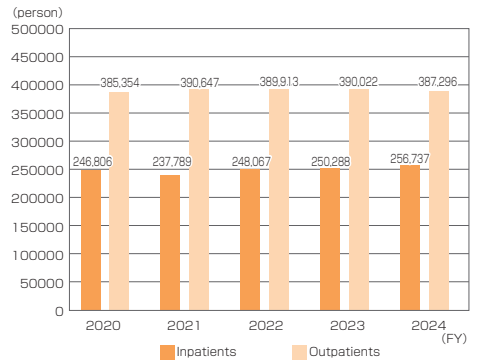

Change in After-graduation Paths for the Past Five Years

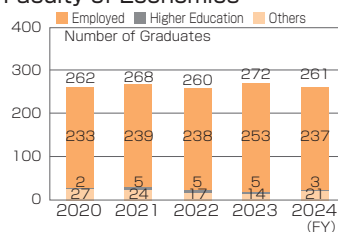

Nagasaki University Logo

Formal Logo



The formal logo was designed in 1949 to raise a sense of common bonds among university members and to provide moral support for them in developing as a university. A Dutch ship representing Nagasaki, the only door for the Western culture during the Period of Isolation, has the initial letters of Nagasaki University “N.U.” on its bow as well as the Chinese character “大學” meaning “university” at its right.

With its reorganization into a National University Corporation, the existing symbol mark was modified on April 1, 2005 to establish the formal university logo.

Informal Logo



The informal logo was designed on April 1, 2005 for use in a variety of more casual occasions.

The yellow line in the center stands for “Students and Faculty”, while the green line on the right is for the “Land Area of Japan and Its Territory” with its rich natural environment. The blue line on the left represents the “Vast Sea with the International Community” surrounding the “Land Area of Japan and Its Territory”.

The points where the lines intersect show “Harmony and Contribution” among the areas, and the yellow circles are meant to express “Creativity”.

Seen as a whole, the yellow line for the “Students and Faculty” and the green line for the “Land Area of Japan and Its Territory” form the inverted Chinese character of “Person”, while the yellow line and the blue line for the “Vast Sea with the International Community” configure “Person” again. All together the lines shape the letter “N” for Nagasaki University.
