Model Answers

- 1. Though both countries have seen a decline from the early 2000s to 2019, the numbers are trending in different directions. The U.S. saw a high of about 45,000 students in the country from 2000 to 2002 and then began to see a gradual decline until the mid-2000s, when the numbers decreased sharply. In Canada, though there has been a slight decrease from the early 2000s to 2019, the numbers have remained relatively steady.
